C. Athlete Eligibility

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY
<p>All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force and only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Olympic Games.</p> <p>Boxers must be born between 1 January 1978 and 31 December 1995.</p> <p>Only boxers who have competed at one of the Qualifying events are eligible to compete.</p> <p>All boxers must satisfy the nationality and medical requirements to compete according to the AIBA Technical and Competition rules.</p>

QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

MEN

5 Places	<p>World Series of Boxing (WSB) Individual Championships</p> <p>All WSB boxers will be ranked through the result of the entire WSB team competition. Only top #1 and #2 ranked boxers will be qualified to compete at the WSB Individual Championships after the team competitions have been completed. The WSB individual Championships will consist of 5 matches in the 5 WSB weight categories. The 5 winners of the WSB Individual Championships obtain a quota place for the London 2012 Olympic Games.</p> <p>Due to the difference of the weight categories between the Olympic Games and WSB competitions, the WSB boxers will have to inform AIBA on the weight category in which they will compete in the London 2012 Olympic Games.</p>

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION
<p>A maximum of six (6) places (5 for Men athletes and 1 for Women athlete) will be reserved for the Host Country. Until the Host Country decides in which weight classes it would like to enter its athletes, AIBA will reserve a place in each of the weight categories, except in the Heavy weight and Super heavy weight categories.</p> <p>The Host Country must select the weight categories in which it would like its six (6) places after the respective AIBA World Boxing Championships. For Men, this selection must be done prior to the European Continental Olympic Qualifying Event.</p> <p>For each place gained by a boxer from the Host Country at the AIBA World Boxing Championships, the Host Country will lose a reserved place.</p> <p>If the Host Country has not already qualified or nominated six (6) boxers following the AIBA World Boxing Championships, they may send athletes to the European Continental Olympic Qualifying Event to compete in the categories where they have not already qualified or nominated boxers.</p>

TRIPARTITE COMMISSION PLACES
<p>19 Tripartite Commission Invitation Places are made available for eligible NOCs.</p> <p>On 1 November 2011, the International Olympic Committee will contact all those NOCs who are eligible to apply for Tripartite Commission Invitation Places.</p> <p>The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests for Tripartite Commission Invitation Places is 16 January 2012. In relation to the end of the qualification period, the Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of invitation places to the respective NOCs between 1 May and 9 July 2012.</p> <p>Detailed information on Tripartite Invitation places is contained in the – Tripartite Commission Invitation Places - Information Paper for NOCs – which is included in the Games of the XXX Olympiad, London 2012 Qualification and Participation Criteria.</p>

E. Confirmation process for quota places

CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES
<p>At the conclusion of each qualifying event, the names of athletes who have gained qualification places will be communicated by AIBA to each NOC.</p> <p>Following AIBA’s notification of qualification places, NOCs must confirm their use of the qualified places to AIBA within two weeks.</p>

F. Reallocation of unused quota places

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED IF QUOTA PLACES

Should an NOC which obtained a quota place through the WSB individual championships decides not to use it, the quota place will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission.

If for any reason an NOC decides not to use a quota place obtained during the AIBA World Championships, the place will be reallocated to the best ranked NOC from the same continent (based on the results of the Continental Olympic Qualifying Event).

If an NOC decides not to use a quota place obtained during the Continental Olympic Qualifying Event, the place will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Any unused Host Country place(s) within the reserved quota of places will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED TRIPARTITE COMMISSION PLACES

Any unused places within the reserved quota of places will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission. Should the Tripartite Commission not be able to assign the places, the quota place will be allocated to the next best ranked athlete at the 2011 AIBA Men’s World Boxing Championship, not yet qualified.
